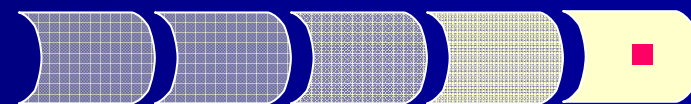
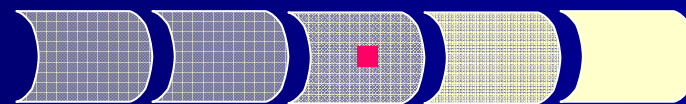

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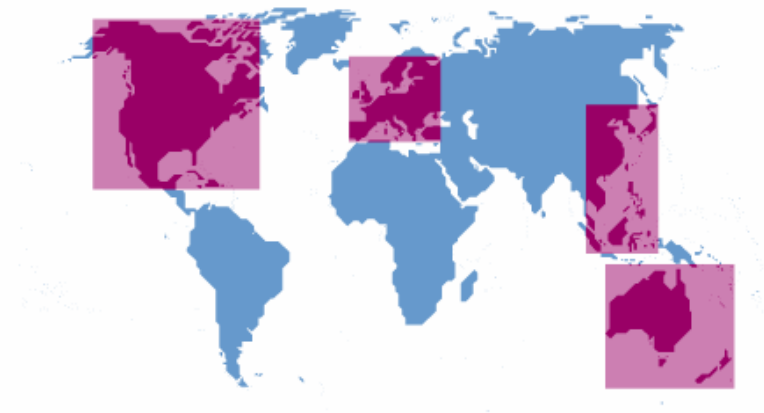
The Network Map

- **Komplette System Änderungen**
 - Hawaii: Gesetzesentwurf zur Einführung eines „Single Payer“-Systems mit universellem Versicherungsschutz für alle
 - Schweiz: Umstellung von einem System der Kopfpauschalen auf ein Sozialversicherungssystem mit Berücksichtigung der Einkommen
