  - → Facilitate discussion of main trends in this session


Plan to write a paper on the basis of the results

- Integrated and long-term care
  - 2019: and mental and palliative care


Sometimes one reform falls into several categories



### 2018 reforms


Strengthening primary care


Reorganizing hospital networks
