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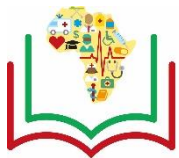
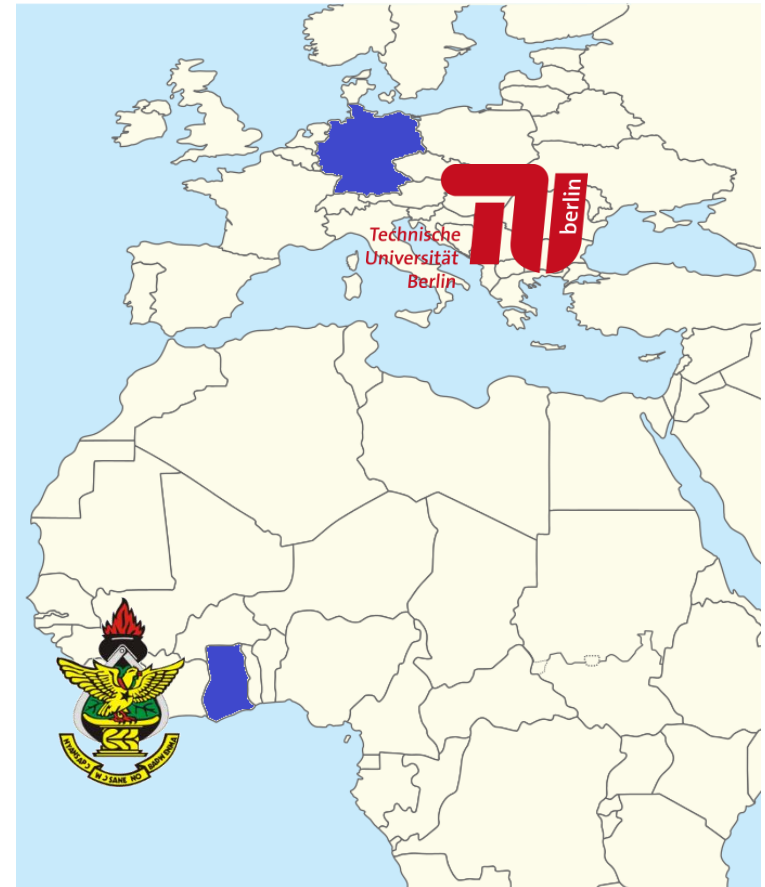

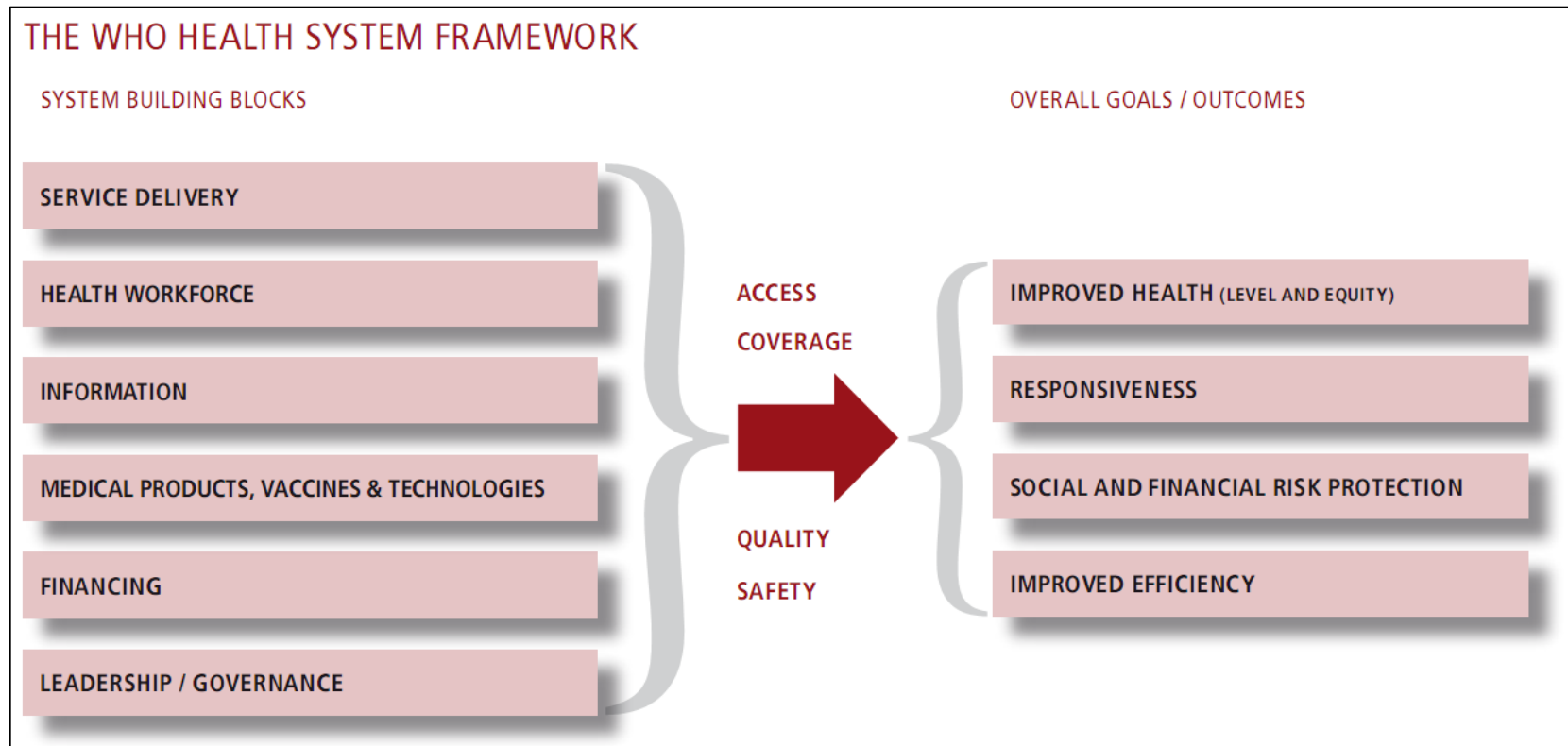
- Originally developed for a MBA Health Care Management programme in 2004
- Great interest by World Bank
- Taught at TU Berlin since 2009; completely revised since spring 2017 for the new MSc. Public Health programme
- Tested in November 2017 for new KNUST programme which started last year (2018/2019 academic year)

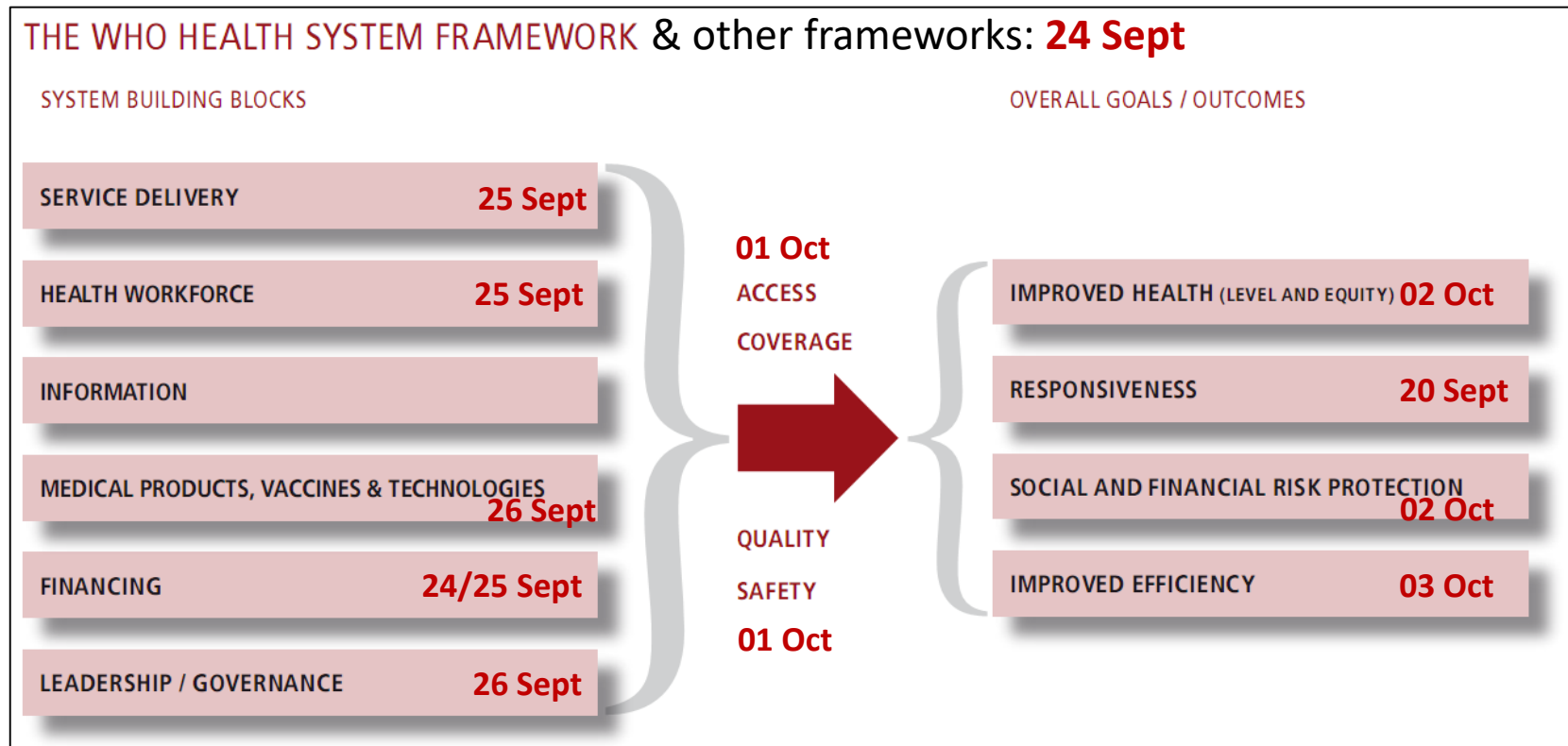
